Propose a new undergraduate course without ACE certification, or make changes to an existing course	College Curriculum & Advising Committee	to the University Curriculum Committee. The 800-level component of a 400/800-level course goes to the Graduate College.
Propose a new undergraduate course with ACE certification	College Curriculum & Advising Committee	to the University Curriculum Committee to be approved as a new course, then to the University Curriculum Committee ACE Subcommittee
Propose a new undergraduate course with Integrative Studies status	College Curriculum & Advising Committee, then to College faculty	to the University Curriculum Committee
Add ACE certification to an existing undergraduate course	College Curriculum & Advising Committee	to the University Curriculum Committee ACE Subcommittee
Propose a new minor or changes to a minor	College Curriculum & Advising Committee, then to College faculty	
Propose a new major	College Curriculum & Advising Committee, then to College faculty	to the Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, then to the Academic Planning Committee, then to the Chancellor, then to the Regents, then to the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education
Propose a change in requirements for a major	College Curriculum & Advising Committee, then to College faculty	
Propose a change of title for a major	College Curriculum & Advising Committee, then to College faculty	to the Academic Planning Committee, then to the Chancellor, then to the Regents
Propose a new graduate course (800-level without a 400-level component, or 900-level), or make changes to a graduate course	College Curriculum & Advising Committee	Graduate College
Proposed change of title for degree or major at graduate level	College Curriculum and Advising Committee, then College Dean	to the UNL Graduate Council, then to the Executive Graduate Council, then Board of Regents, then the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education
Change in department title	Dean	Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, then to the Chancellor, then the Board of Regents.
