



## LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER / SEXUALITY STUDIES

The LGBTQ / sexuality studies minor involves the examination of sexuality and gender through an interdisciplinary lens. You will have the opportunity to analyze sexuality and gender as social constructions that vary throughout history and in different societies, learn about the experience and histories of LGBTQ people and communities, and examine how sexuality and gender intersect with other forms of inequality and difference.
