The Public Policy Analysis Certificate (PPAC) is an interdisciplinary program that allows you to gain skills related to the policy process and the methodology for analyzing policy problems and programs.

The Public Policy Analysis Certificate will appear on your official transcript and gives you a skill that can be placed on your resume. Employers in all fields want to hire students who are analytical and evaluative.

1ST LEVEL (6 CREDITS, REQUIRED)

Covers the theories, processes, models, and methods of policy analysis.

- **POLS 235** Public Policy: Concepts and Processes
- **POLS 236** Public Policy Analysis: Methods and Models

2ND LEVEL (3 CREDITS)

Examines the interpersonal, interagency and inter-group negotiation processes within which policy making occurs. Select **one**:

- **COMM / ETHN 311** Intercultural and Intergroup Communication
- **POLS 320** Political Persuasion & Advocacy Strategy
- **POLS / SOCI 261** Conflict and Conflict Resolution

3RD LEVEL (6 CREDITS)

Applies models, methods, and the understanding of the policy process in policy areas. Select **two** from more than 60 classes.

4TH LEVEL (3 CREDITS)

Internship (capstone experience). Students intern in a governmental or nonprofit agency relating to their area of interest or expertise developed through the 1st–3rd levels.
